Spelling	Definition/ Sentence
neighbour	A place next to or near to another place.
language	A system of communicating.
canal	A canal is a long, narrow stretch of water that has been made for boats to travel along or to bring water to a particular area.
abbey	An abbey is a church with buildings attached to it in which monks or nuns live or used to live.
mountain range	A series of adjoining mountains or a line of mountains.
forest	A forest is a large area where trees grow close together.
