# **Speak Out Stay Safe**

This half term we will be participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. online programme. This consists of an online assembly delivered by school staff and supporting classroom based activities. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way.

Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. In the online assembly, the Speak out. Stay safe. messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. Year 5 and 6 children will also be participating in a workshop. In addition to this children in Years 1-4 will include "NSPCC PANTS" as part of their PSHE lessons this half term. 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# A parent's guide to keeping kids healthy this school year

As a new school year begins, parents can help to slow the spread of seasonal illnesses and avoid unnecessary absences. 


















Year 4 had a lovely time in the pond area creating caves from clay as part of their Talk 4 Writing unit.
