Dussindale Positive Behaviour Policy

This year we have introduced a new positive behaviour policy. We have four simple rules 'Be Ready, Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Resilient', which can be applied to a variety of situations. We understand that for some children following our behaviour expectations are beyond their developmental level. In this case, these children will have bespoke positive behaviour plans.

The tables below show the steps that are taken by staff to support children with their behaviour. If your child has reached the "consequence stage" and has received "time in" the class teacher will contact you to let you know what happened. Incidents involving child on child abuse are dealt with swiftly by the Senior Leadership Team, case by case, with the appropriate consequence given and parents informed.

As part of their art lessons Year 5 have explored sketching different fonts. They also enjoyed their team building day at the start of the week.


