TTRS

During this half term, we will introduce multiplication and division as part of our Maths learning. We will then send out more information about how the children can access Times Table Rockstars at practise their times tables at home.

What we're learning

English

In Talk for Writing, we will be learning about how to write an exciting adventure journey story, based on the text 'Meerkat Mail.'

Maths

In Maths, we will be learning about money and then focusing on multiplication and division, starting with the two times table.

Science

Our enquiry question for Science is 'How do animals and humans survive?'

Geography

Our enquiry question for Gepgraphy is 'What is it like in hot and cold parts of the world?'

Learning at Home

Your child will receive a paper copy of this half term's home learning grid this week and a copy will be posted on Class Dojo and the school website. For each home learning task completed (each box), the class teacher will award one Dojo point.

There are a mixture of compulsary and optional tasks. Children can complete all tasks if they wish.

To help the class teacher know which tasks have been completed we need parents to date and sign each box when tasks are done and then return the paper copy to the class teacher <u>each Friday</u>. Not all tasks require a piece of work, so signing the sheet helps the the class teacher know that the task has been completed.

Any tasks that require a recorded piece of work can be brought into school each week or shared on your child's Class Dojo portfolio (not through Dojo messaging please).
